VECTOR CONTROL HONORS TRUSTEE CHUCK LEONARD FOR 21 YEARS OF SERVICE

LAKEPORT, Calif. –Chuck Leonard was honored with a plaque commemorating his 21 years of service to Lake County as a trustee on the Lake County Vector Control District Board of Trustees.

Mr. Leonard served on the District's Board of Trustees between March 2001 and July 2023. He stepped down from the LCVCD Board in 2003 to serve as the Special District Alternate on the Lake County Local Area Formation Council (LAFCO) before returning to the LCVCD Board in 2005.

While on the Lake County Vector Control District Board, Chuck also served on the Clearlake City Council and the Lake Area Planning Council (Lake APC). He was an active participant in the District's Board meetings and discussions. He was well-versed in the Brown Act and committed to complying with all aspects of it to ensure the public's right to participate.

Chuck thanked the Vector Control District for the honor and expressed that he enjoyed a wonderful experience during his tenure on the board. The July 2023 meeting was his last meeting as a trustee.
